IDENTIFICATION: Seven species of sea turtles exist worldwide. They vary in size and weight with the leatherback being the largest – reaching lengths of 4 to 8 feet and weights of 500 to 2000 pounds. Three (loggerhead, Kemp's ridley, and green) of the seven species of sea turtles that exist worldwide are known to nest at Bon Secour National Wildlife Refuge in Baldwin and Mobile counties. Loggerheads are the most common sea turtle found nesting on Alabama beaches. Sea turtles come ashore May - August to lay eggs that will hatch July - October.

FORESTRY CONSIDERATIONS: Forestry activities should not impact sea turtle populations or habitat. Baby sea turtles may be disoriented by light when hatching.

DISTRIBUTION BY COUNTY: Gulf coast beaches located in Baldwin and Mobile counties.
